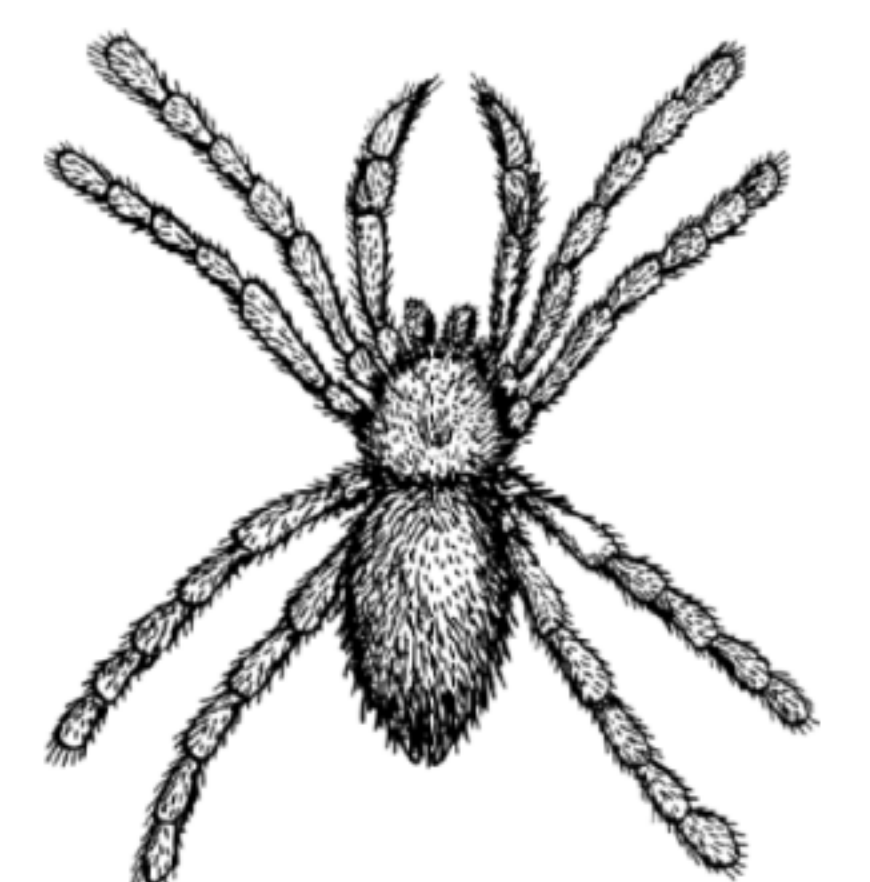
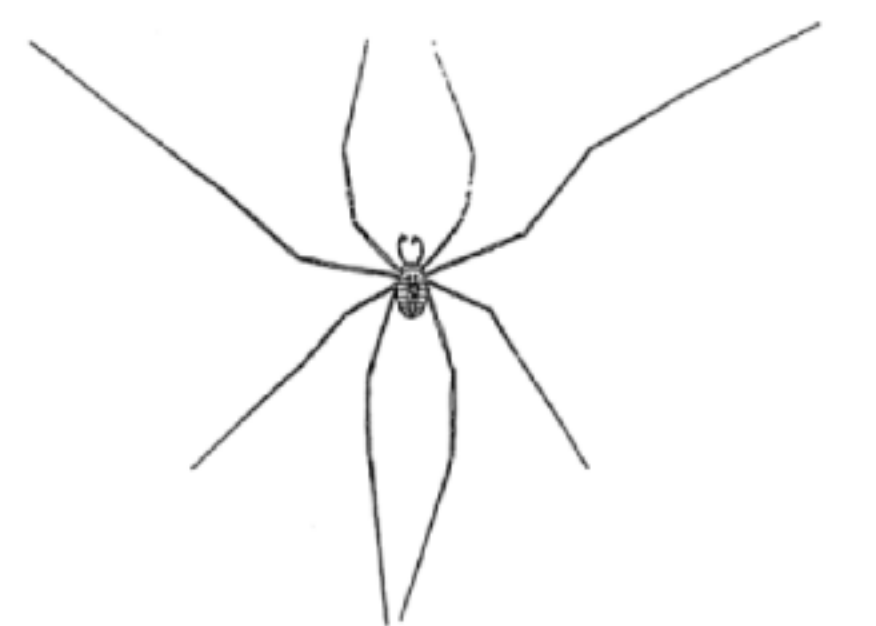
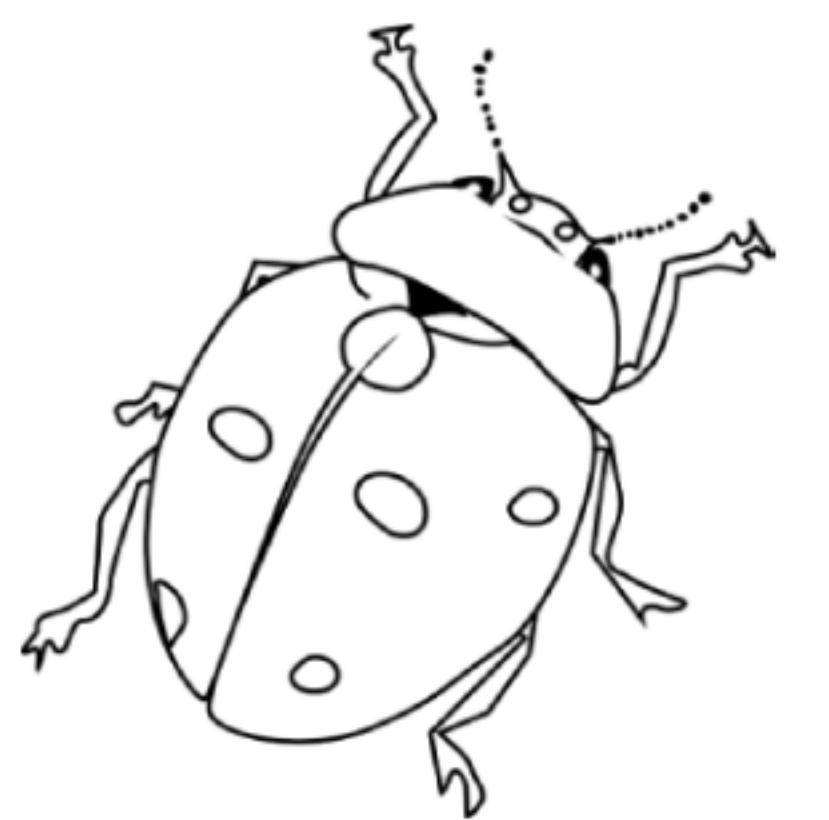
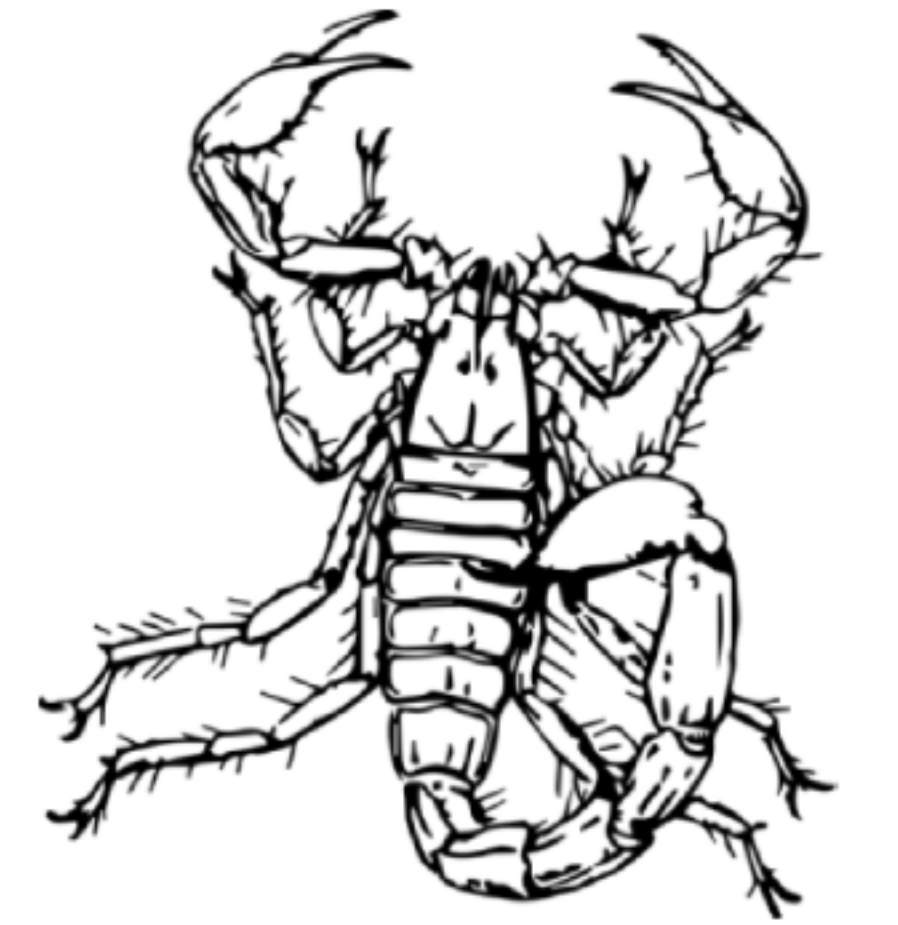
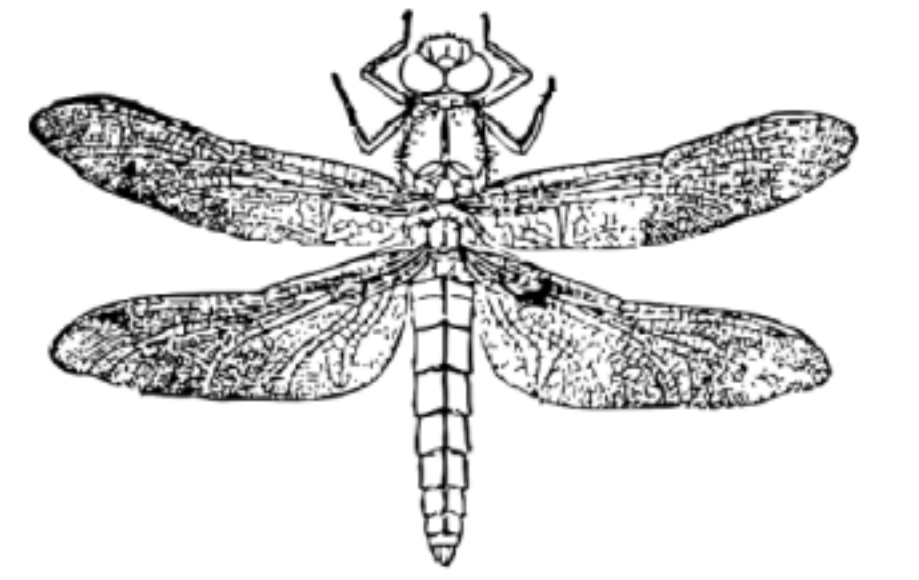


Insects

Arachnids



Insects:

Insects have three body parts: head, thorax, and abdomen.

They have six legs attached to the thorax.

Insects have two antennae on their head, which they use to sense their environment.

Most insects have wings, which help them fly.

Arachnids:

Arachnids have two body parts: cephalothorax (head and thorax combined) and abdomen.

They have eight legs attached to the cephalothorax.

Arachnids do not have antennae; instead, they use sensory hairs to detect their surroundings.

Arachnids do not have wings and cannot fly.

North America Specific Examples:

Honeybee: Insect

Description: Honeybees are small, flying insects that collect nectar to make honey. They are important pollinators for many plants.

Tarantula: Arachnid
